Mtayachalo, others ditch Nawakwi's FDD

YOTAM Mtayachalo, Solomon Mbuzi and the entire Chama North ward and constituency executive committees have resigned from the Forum for Democracy and Development (FDD) citing poor leadership among other things.

In a letter dated October 13, 2020, Mtayachalo stated that following a meeting, the entire Chama North and South constituency and district leadership resolved to resign from the party.

"Following recent unfortunate developments in the party, failure to embark on party mobilization activities in readiness for the 2021 general election..."

PF MEDIA director Sunday Chanda says Movement for Democratic Change (MDC) president Felix Mutati should tame his secretary general Lucky Mulusa's excitement before it becomes injurious to his persona.

And Chanda says the PF wants democracy to thrive and would hate to see MDC's lifespan shredded to pieces before it starts to walk.

Meanwhile, Chanda says no right thinking member of the PF would want to join MDC because it is a party led by people who were fired from government.

Last week, Mulusa said Zambia is right in the last stages of a failed State.

Mulusa, whose last post in government was Minister of National Development Planning, also revealed that he broke ranks with the Patriotic Front after noticing that collective

responsibility was turning into collective irresponsibility among government officials that he was working with.

But in an interview, Chanda said Mulusa failed to comprehend collective responsibility the whole time he served in government.

"We have welcomed the formation of MDC because it is testimony that contrary to what the doom sayers have been propagating. Zambia's democratic space is not shrinking but it is growing. Those who believe that the democratic space in Zambia is shrinking are those who have outlived their usefulness to the democratic equation of this

country and they cannot offer any relevance anymore. And I don't think they must bring it to the democratic space. They must leave it on their inability to reinvent themselves. The democratic space in this country is growing and flourishing. When you see new political parties being birthed and of course some of those forming them are people who have been in the democratic space for some time. We can pride ourselves as the Patriotic Front and say that we have scored well in terms of growing Zambia's democratic space," Chanda said.

"And unfortunately, for the whole period that Mr Mulusa served as either an advisor to the president or as cabinet minister, he failed to comprehend one thing called collective responsibility. It is immoral that Mr Lucky Mulusa will today wish to project himself as an angel of light when the decisions which were made were made under the binding of the collective agreements. I am happy that his leader honorable Felix Mutati understands collective responsibility better than his secretary general Mr Mulusa."

Chanda said Mulusa was probably under the influence of alcohol when he described those fire trucks as wheelbarrows.

"And I want to place it on record that probably, Mr Mulusa was drunk when he made those remarks about the 48 fire engines. Mr Mulusa was 1/10, I believe that he was probably drunk when he made those remarks because as minister, he was expected to understand tender processes, procurement procedures better than any other person. But clearly I think speaking off the

cuff and under the influence of something and I would want to suspect it was under the influence of beer, he made outrageous remarks as a senior government official showing that we were dealing with someone who was incapable of comprehending collective responsibility, and also to understand that there are institutions set up by law to oversee tender procurement processes and that that is not the doing of the president. But clearly here is a man who did not understand what he was up to," Chanda said.

And Chanda said Mutati should tame Mulusa's excitement before it causes damage to his persona.

"Let me advise Mr Mulusa that his attempt to drag the former Finance minister in his rhetoric might just prove to be more injurious in the long run for Honourable Mutati. And we advise Honourable Mutati to ensure that he zips Mulusa's mouth and if he can tame and manage his excitement because he can cause irreparable damage to the persona of Honorable Mutati," Chanda said.

Chanda said the MDC should focus on issues if it wants to remain relevant in politics, warning that failure to do so might cause casualties.

"And we also want to place on record here that Zambia will rise above its current challenges including this COVID-19 pandemic which has affected the economy and the adverse effects we're feeling today. Mr Mulusa is being hypocritical when he talks about government borrowing because had government not borrowed, the Chingola-Solwezi Road would have been in the same state. And unless he doesn't believe that we did well to wipe off his tears by ensuring that that road was worked on. And it is also important that we caution the MDC and its leaders that they are far from being set. And if they want to be relevant, we would advise them to focus on issues, otherwise there will be major casualties. From the point of view of the Patriotic Front, we want democracy to thrive and we would be hurt to see MDC's lifespan shredded to pieces even before it starts to walk. So, if Mr Mulusa wants to tell lies about President Lungu and the Patriotic Front, we will have no option but to tell the truth about him," he added.

Meanwhile, asked if the PF was not afraid that it would lose some of its members to the MDC, Chanda wondered what would motivate a right thinking member of his party to join a party led by people who were fired.

"Democracy provides for the freedom of choice. It provides for people to move from one political party to another. And whether we like it or not, Zambian politics are nomadic. But we would want to really understand what would really motivate any right thinking member of the Patriotic Front to move from a party that is winning elections to a party that is being led by people who were fired, not even people who resigned but were fired by His Excellency President Lungu," said Chanda.

Caritas attributes shrinking civic space to national dialogue failure

CARITAS Zambia executive director Eugene Kabilika says failure of the national dialogue process is the cause of the fast shrinking civic space in Zambia.

In an interview, Kabilika said the National Dialogue Forum was insignificant because it focused on constitutional reforms while overlooking glaring divisions going on in the country.

"We are having all these problems because of the failed dialogue process which was completely overlooked by key political players. Key political players in this case, I am talking about the government in power, they should not have brought the NDF, national dialogue forum to replace the national dialogue process because then the dimension changed, NDF only began to talk about constitutional reforms but it overlooked the glaring division that was happening in the country. And now the divisions are becoming wider and wider. It is either you are PF or you are opposition or you are what. Either you are this tribe or you are that tribe, you can't go on like that in a country and the only person who can help us to come together are those who are given the instruments of power, they can mobilise people, they can make sure people come to the round table to discuss," Kabilika said.

He said if nothing was done about the divisions in the country, it might breed chaos. *Story Continues on P7*

IBA partners with MISA, BBC Media Action to curb disruption of radio programmes

THE Independent Broadcasting Authority (IBA) says it is worried about the disruption of radio programmes by political cadres.

And Mazabuka UPND member of parliament Gary Nkombo says it is clear that the ruling Patriotic Front is failing to manage its cadres.

In a brief interview, IBA director general Josephine Mapoma said the Authority had plans to engage various stakeholders on the same this November.

"On 19th of November, in conjunction with some donors, we will be engaging political parties, Journalists, and other stakeholders. We will work in conjunction with MISA Zambia and BBC media action. We are equally worried about what is happening," said Mapoma.

And in a separate interview, Nkombo said PF did not want the opposition to

engage citizens because they were advocating for a one party state.

"It has now become clear that the PF are failing to manage their cadres who are above the police. If you recall, the issue of radio station attacks started a long time ago, back at the Sun FM in Ndola, in Mpika there was an attack and it continues. So for Mr (Sunday) Chanda to say that we should be talking to the police when we want to go on the radio is draconian. It is jungle law they are using and they have now exposed themselves to the fact that PF cadres are stronger than the police and they will not allow people to the public because they want to advocate into a

one party state," said Nkombo
Last week, PF media
director Sunday Chanda
advised politicians to engage
police before appearing on
any radio programs because
not everyone was tolerant to
divergent views.

"As we begin to get closer to the general elections, people take politics differently and it is always important when there is such a program happening, politicians engage the police for their own safety and the safety of other people. Because not all of us will be tolerant to divergent views. This happens not just in PF strongholds. Not long ago, Fr Bwalya was beaten by UPND members in Mazabuka when he featured on Mazabuka Radio. So there is a likelihood of such events happening, not just restricted in PF strongholds. Even speaking for myself, if I want to feature on a radio station whether it is in Monze or in Mazabuka, I am not going to last three minutes in that radio station. So if I want to feature on any radio program, the first thing I would do is to inform the police because it is not just because of my own safety but the safety of the people working in the radio station," said Chanda.

UPND officials beat up Mpika residents who refused to respond to their slogans, claims Wina

VICE-PRESIDENT Inonge Wina says some Mpika and Serenje residents were beaten up by UPND officials after they refused to respond to the opposition party's slogans.

And Vice-President Wina has urged police officers not to condone any lawlessness in the country as was the case in the two areas.

Meanwhile, Vice-President Wina has urged political leaders to ensure that they familiarise themselves with ethnic tribes in order to avoid landing themselves in problems by using offensive words.

During the Vice-President's question time, Friday, Serenje member of parliament Maxwell Kabanda asked what government's position was over the abduction of policemen in Mpika and the trail of destruction that was left in that area where properties were damaged.

In her response, Vice-President Wina said UPND cadres beat up Mpika residents for not responding to their slogans.

"Mr Speaker, the abduction of government workers in this case of police officers is very regrettable. And the abduction was carried out by people who are known party cadres. And some of them were even leaders who engaged in this exercise. The police officers were guarding the area and then a convoy passed by showing slogans of

their party. And the people standing on the road side who did not respond were beaten by this group of hooligans driving in a convoy. And these were UPND cadres. And two police officers were injured and the ammunition taken from their guns and then sent away to tell their story. Some of them are in hospital now," Vice-President Wina said.

She said it would be worrying if the abduction incident symbolized the beginning of Armageddon.

"Mr Speaker it's very regrettable that things like this can happen in our country. Or maybe it's the beginning of the state of turbulence that we have heard about. If we start to be unruly before we even end the year going into 2021 at election time, I don't know how the situation would be like. And I want to urge our police officers that they should not condone any lawlessness as we saw in Mpika and Serenje. The officers who were supposed to intercept this group of hooligans left them scotfree and now they have escaped the law. But they will be followed because they are known. So, Mr Speaker, it's very unfortunate that incidences of this nature can arise where violence is used on innocent people who should be protecting our politicians but instead they are beaten. I hope this is not the beginning of Armageddon that we hear about," Vice-President Wina said.

And when asked by Senga Hill

MP Kapembwa Simbao if Zambia was still safe following the indiscriminate use of some Bemba idioms by some political leaders, Vice-President Wina encouraged political leaders to familiarize themselves ethic tribes before using them.

"Mr Speaker, we are one Zambia one nation and we use each other's language. However, before you learn another ethnic group's language, it's better to know which words are offensive and which words are for this and that. It's unfortunate that some of the words were used which either are derogatory or offensive being used by people who may not understand the language fully. And some languages are full of idioms. So, if you are taken by the flowery nature of that language, you can land yourself into problems. I encourage Zambians to learn these languages but to be weary of how we use the language especially where we are not sure about the meaning of the words that we want to use, especially in public because public pronouncements have wider repercussions. So, when you use words at a public rally, you have to weigh the impact of those words on your audience. And I believe this is being considered by our leaders and that our leaders will take note after what transpired in Lukashya constituency and other areas where offensive words were used," Vice-President Wina said.

Meanwhile, when Chavuma UPND

member of parliament Victor Lumayi asked her when government would release funds to work on the dilapidated Chieke-Chingi road and other township roads in his constituency, Vice-President Wina encouraged parliamentarians to develop a habit of liaising with line ministries.

"Mr Speaker, as members of parliament, we should be very concerned about the state of not only roads but the welfare of our people in the constituencies. And we can only source this information from the line ministries. I would like to see a situation where members of parliament engage the technocrats in various ministries to inquire on the various projects that the government is rolling out in these areas and we will get more and better information than to wait until you get to parliament for the Vice President's question time to ask such a question. Mr Speaker, the government is very committed in improving rural connectivity to ensure that our people in rural areas can travel on passable roads particularly as they take their produce to the markets. So, we are committed as the government to ensure that roads in North Western Province will be looked at as we are doing in other areas. So, Mr Speaker, I will still urge the MP to interact with the infrastructure ministry to see how the three roads that he mentioned can be attended to," said Vice-President Wina.

And party chairman for agriculture Levy Ngoma says the party will not avail its leader Hakainde Hichilema to police in Mpika as doing so will be taking themselves into a PF trap.

Meanwhile, Hichlema was yesterday blocked from visiting his counterpart Chishimba Kambwili in prison after officers told him to get clearance from Minister of Home Affairs Stephen Kampyongo before he could be admitted.

Last week, Mpika police summoned Hichilema and Kang'ombe over some incidences which transpired when they were in the area.

And on Friday, Home Affairs Minister Stephen Kampyongo charged that Kang'ombe was in the vehicle where two police officers and five civil servants were bundled after being abducted.

"The occupants of the vehicle on which the two officers were bundled included the member of parliament for Sesheke constituency, honourable Romeo

for Sesheke constituency, honourable Romeo Kangombe. So dear colleagues, besides the two officers, five other people including two civil servants, an agricultural extension officer, a veterinary officer and three community members who stood by the road side were also attacked by this militia group and they sustained serious injuries and multiple deep cuts. In addition, the seven casualties recorded, the UPND militia group also stole properties which included a Lenovo laptop, a wallet, a shaving machine, cell phones and cash money amounting to K2,400. All the stolen items were valued at approximately K10,000. Furthermore, one residential

house had the spare bedroom and kitchen window glass panes deliberately damaged. This damage of the residential house is yet to be ascertained," said Kampyongo.

But in an interview, Kangombe said Kampyongo's statement was nothing but lies and malice.

"It's malice, it's not true. My comment is it's not true, what the Home Affairs Minister should have done is that before issuing the statement, I am his colleague, I am a member of parliament just like him, I am his young brother for that matter. He should have engaged me to get the truth from me, not rushing to the media. I never got any civil servant, so I am waiting for an official call out then I will respond, I will go to the police. As at now, I haven't received any [official summon] so when I receive, I will appear," he said.

When asked if he was worried that Kampyongo's statement would influence investigations, he said he was waiting to see how events would unfold.

"I don't know, I am just waiting. Its in public domain so you guys will be following the event as they unfold. If I may ask you, how can you identify a police officer? It's by way of uniform or an ID, so I had none in that context and as far as I am concerned, there were no people abducted," said Kangombe.

And at a press briefing, Sunday, Ngoma wondered why Hichilema was being summoned despite being a victim of a PF attack.

"Those are the aggressors, those are the ones who are supposed to be the accused, shamelessly, you hear one Hakainde Hichilema being summoned to appear before an institution, the police, for a crime that he never

committed. The United Party for National Development in this regard has not committed a crime, ves there is those summons which the police have prepared. If you were to pose a question, do we attend to such? Your answer is as a good as mine. No law abiding citizen will take himself in harm's way. This trap that the Patriotic Front have set before us that we should go to wherever they could be summoning us, we are way ahead of them because we have got information, factually so that from Kabwe, Kapiri, Mkushi, Serenje, Mpika, they have lined up their cadres so that mayhem breaks out, peoples lives get to be lost in the process. We are not going to fall into such a trap," said Ngoma.

"There are other ways and means which can be pursued to pursue this matter, those other means, we are ready but for this call, to go and throw ourselves in harm's way, the UPNDs position is that it

is not attainable and we are not ready for that. That is the position because we are the victims."

And during the same briefing, party secretary general Stephen Katuka demanded the arrest of Esau Ngoma who was identified as one of the people who was throwing stones at Hichilema's convoy in Serenje.

"We demand as a party for the arrest of one Esau Jere who has been mentioned as one of those who was throwing stones and is a known figure, he is a chairman for Serenje PF and there is another one who was the chairman for Lukashya who was there and has been identified. Those are the people we demand the police to arrest before they can send call out to innocent people," said Katuka.

In a letter dated October 13, 2020, Mtayachalo stated that following a meeting, the entire Chama North and South constituency and district leadership resolved to resign from the party.

"Following unfortunate developments in the party, failure to embark on party mobilization activities in readiness for the 2021 general election and more importantly the meeting which was held on 27th September 2020 in Chama district comprising of Chama north and Chama south constituencies and the district leaderships respectively which discussed the way forward the entire constituencies and district leaderships including the general membership resolved to resign from Forum for Democracy and Development(FDD). In view of the foregoing my continued membership in this political

party has become unattainable and as such I regret to inform you that I have resigned from Forum for Democracy and Development (FDD) with immediate effect. Further constituencies and the district leaderships in Chama district will be communicating to the party secretariat about the resolutions of the meeting of 27th September 2020 in due course," he stated.

Mtayachalo, who is former chairperson for labor and employment and acting chairperson for information and publicity noted that he was leaving the party without any hard feelings and appreciated the opportunity given to him to serve in senior positions.

"However I would like to take this opportunity to thank the party President madam Edith Nawakwi, the National Policy Committee(NPC) and the general membership of the party for the confidence which was bestowed on me as evidenced from several senior party positions I previously held in the party and consequently I'm highly indebted to the organization for the rare privilege which was accorded to me during my

tour of duty in the party thus enabling me to leave the FDD as a very happy man with no hard feelings against anyone," stated Mtayachalo.

"Furthermore I would be failing in my duties if once more I did not acknowledge and appreciates the massive grass root support I received from the entire general membership of the party countrywide and as such I would like to wish them all the best in their future political endeavours as I also reflect seriously with the local leadership in Chama district on which political direction to take and the nation shall soon be informed about which political party the entire FDD membership in Chama shall join after consultations."

Meanwhile, Mbuzi, in a separate statement, Sunday, said FDD in Chama district was dead as the entire leadership.

"It is in light of the foregoing that I would like to inform the people of Chama and the national at large that myself, the entire ward and constituency executive committees for Chama north have also followed suit and we have also tendered our resignations from the FDD with immediate effect. This now signifies that the FDD is now dead and buried in Chama district and very soon we shall decide to join a progressive political party of people's wish where the entire membership of FDD shall belong to and victory for that political party in Chama north shall be assured because we shall campaign for the party president and the party vigorously. In conclusion on behalf of the party in Chama north constituency I would like to assure Mr Mtayachalo of our unwavering support wherever he decides to go because we believe he is the man full of passion and the drive for the people of Chama and we have no doubt that using his abundance wealth of experience in leadership he shall take the constituency to greater heights and more importantly we are comforted with the support the people of Chama north have invested in him," he stated.

"Furthermore the decision to resign from FDD was arrived at the meeting which was held on 27th September, 2020 in Chama district because of poor leadership and authoritarian type of leadership which Nawakwi

has continued to exhibit no wonder since the death of our great leader Lt General Christon Tembo the party has lamentably failed to make an impact on the Zambian political stage because the current visionless leadership which has continued to violate the party constitution with impunity as members who demand for holding of constitutional meetings such as national policy committee meetings and national convention are suspended and expelled from the part, hence many of these members do not question the leadership for fear of reprisals."

Further the standing committee of the National Policy Committee(I.2c) has no such powers to expel a member of the party as in accordance with Article 19(a) of party constitution it mandates the committee to report to the NPC on all matters affecting disciplinary cases before it, stated Mbuzi.

"Therefore we are challenge these two leaders to tells us when the NPC was held to purportedly expel Mr. Mtayachalo from the party and above all as per article 18(i) of the party constitution the powers to suspend any party member are limited and rests in the NPC and as such we are taken aback that someone aspiring for the highest office in the land is ignorant about the party constitution which is shameful."

DEMOCRATIC Party leader Harry Kalaba, his Movement for Democratic Change counterpart Felix Mutati and PF 2021 aspiring presidential candidate Kelvin Bwalya Fube yesterday commemorated the National Day of prayer, fasting and reconciliation at Saint Johns United Church of Zambia congregation in Chimanimani, Kabwe.

The duo joined hundreds of congregants and KBF was the preacher.

In his sermon, KBF said the political mood in the country was tense because of the unresolved issues and the suppression of the freedoms to freely speak and assemble.

And KBF said it was wrong for political leaders in power to say that a particular tribe would never rule Zambia because it was God who appointed leaders

"The political scene today is just as it was in the times of the Apostle Peter when the leaders threatened him with arrest for preaching about Jesus. We see threats, intimidation and suppression of fundamental freedoms of assembly and speech. How can you reconcile, when you are not allowing your political opponents to enjoy the freedoms in the constitution?" KBF asked.

KBF said genuine reconciliation was only possible if politicians admitted that

there were problems on the political scene and openly discussed to resolve them.

"We cannot talk of reconciliation without acknowledging the problem and identifying the person with whom we have a problem with. When you are wrong, seek peace. When you are guilty, seek peace. Unresolved conflicts can break fellowship with God and one another." he said.

And the Lusaka Lawyer said it was wrong for political leaders to state that a particular tribe would never rule Zambia because God had the power to appoint a person of his choice in leadership.

He said politicians should learn to tame their tongues and desist from tribal remarks because such conduct could lead the nation into civil strife.

"We must be very careful with what we say as politicians. Tribal remarks such as 'Bembas are thieves' or 'this tribe will never rule Zambia'; will land us in trouble. It's not up to any political party to determine which tribe should rule because it is up to God," said KBF, who pledged a total of K50,000 towards the completion of the church building and K10,000 towards the boys and girls groups.

And speaking during the service, Mutati asked the Church to pray for political party leaders.

Mutati said October 18 was significant because it was the day when the nation

could heal from wounds afflicted on each other.

"Today is the day of national prayers. Prayer to reconcile ourselves. Prayer to be able to heal the wounds that we may have inflicted on each other. Today is a great day when the nation of Zambia and it's people must come as one nation as one under the same God. Today's talk must be above preaching the unite in diversity. We should peach peace and preach reconciliation as a nation, the responsibility of what we do as political party lies in you because you are the ones who choose. So choose properly and pray for us politicians," Mutati said.

He said Zambia had many challenges which might slide the nation towards a cross road.

"As a nation, we have many challenges and sometimes, there is a feeling that we are sliding as a nation towards the cross road. There is nothing greater than coming together as one," said Mutati.

And Kalaba said politicians were Christians first before anything else.

"Today I did not come for politics but to pray. We are Christians first before we are politicians and so today bring the day as it is, I will rely on Matthews 5:24 the Bible says 'before you go to the alter, reconcile first with your brother' and that is why today the three of us have found ourselves here because of unity. Today is a point of unity," said Kalaba.

LEADER of the Opposition in Parliament Jack Mwiimbu has warned that if elections are not handled properly, it will create a crisis in Zambia.

But deputy chief whip says UPND is not a parallel government for it to start dictating how the Electoral Commission of Zambia should operate.

Debating a motion by Vice-President Inonge Wina for the House to support the K325 million 2021 budget for ECZ, Friday, Mwimbu said the ECZ, in its current state is a danger to peace.

"Madam chairperson, I want to state that the Electoral Commission of Zambia in its current state is a danger to the peace of this country because they have been very inconsistent in the way they want to manage elections in this country. You do recall, madam chairperson, that a month ago, the electoral commission, through the chief electoral officer at the ECZ held a press conference and told the nation that the current register of voters will be used provided that you go to the polling station and verify your particulars. When the President of the Republic of Zambia came to this House, when he announced that there will be a new list of voters. the Electoral Commission of Zambia summer-sorted like an F16 and said that they are cancelling the register of voters," Mwiimbu said.

He warned that if elections were not handled properly, it would create a crisis in the country.

"Madam chairperson you have to realize that in any country, elections are key to the governance of the country. And if you don't handle it properly, you create chaos and anarchy. We therefore call upon the electoral commission to handle matters

of elections prudently and professionally for the sake of this country. That is what we are all asking for as stakeholders. We are asking for a transparent manner of handling the elections. We don't know why the electoral commission is insisting that members of the public who are not able to access internet should register through that platform. Members of the public in Nalolo, in Nabwalva or in Shangombo and most of these areas do not have telephone connectivity. The people of Zambia, madam chairperson, are listening and we are supposed to be representing the people of this country," Mwiimbu said.

Mwiimbu, who is also Monze Central UPND member of parliament, insisted that registering nine million voters in one month was illogical, given the COVID-19 pandemic which meant restrictions on large gatherings.

"We know that in Makululu in Kabwe who are going to vote out a certain MP have been complaining this system. Madam Speaker, we are aware that there is COVID-19 in this country and there are regulations. How do you expect to register nine million voters in one month when the regulations are saying 'you must not congregate in large numbers.' As if that is not enough madam speaker, in the Northern region of this country, Luapula, North Western, it's now raining heavily. How do you expect the poor peasant [farmers] in these areas to rise and queue up maybe for one week and register as voters at the expense of providing food for their children? We are creating a crisis deliberately. Whom are we trying to please by creating a crisis in this country? What is the problem with having the current register and only allowing people to verify their particulars?" he asked.

Mwiimbu also insisted that Zambia had two laws, one for every citizen and another for PF members.

"Madam Speaker, we are aware that in this country, there are two laws; one for

the ordinary Zambians and one for the PF. Whenever the PF commit offenses in this country, nothing is being done. And during the elections, the electoral commission is impotent. Complaints have been raised [but] the Electoral commission have been saying that 'our hands are tied.' We are aware where ministers are being beaten by PF cadres. We are aware where PF cadres have attacked police stations. There is impunity in this country we are aware of cadres who are calling themselves America one and Commander One and in Lukashya, they had press conferences with the chief whip here, directing them to take the appropriate action. How can you allow impunity to reign in this country just because you belong to a certain political party," said Mwiimbu.

But Ngulube said UPND should not attack the ECZ to hide their mischievous activities.

"Madam Speaker, allow me say I am very disappointed with the caliber of debates that we are trying to bring to this House. As leaders, we must be seen to be uniting this nation. We will not allow that every time somebody stands up they want to be threatening the nation, threaten MPs, threaten the ruling party. Before you even form government you should be threatening people. Who do you think you are? Madam speaker, allow me to say that there is a threat that the ECZ is a danger to this nation but how do they come to this parliament if the ECZ is a danger? They have lost squarely. All the by-elections that have been there, they lose because the ECZ is neutral. We have been losing in Southern Province, Western and other

strongholds because the ECZ is neutral. So, let them not attack the ECZ to hide their mischievous activities," Ngulube said.

"Madam Speaker, I am aware that just in 2016 after the presidential election and there was an election petition, some mercenaries and imperialists funded a lot of money because some people believed there was going to be a re-run. We want to know where is that money and how have you used that money, because you want to hide trying to pretend to be clean when the donors and those people who gave you that money are still asking how you used that money if it was not meant to discredit the ECZ? Please explain to the people of Zambia and to your fellow MPs how that money was used because you can't be getting rich when you are in the opposition."

Ngulube also said it was not true that the PF had special laws which protected him.

"Madam speaker, I want to say that this issue of saying that two sets of laws, one for PF, we cannot always allow people who on one hand they attack the police and abduct them, and then pretend to be neutral. I want to say Madam Speaker that if I were a police officer somewhere in charge of some province, those people would have been in cells now. And we will not condone any kind of threats of violence, whether you want to defend yourselves or not, there is a state somewhere which will take charge," Ngulube said.

Ngulube said UPND were massaging their ears by saying they are about to form government.

"Madam Speaker, they have been massaging their

ears thinking they are about to form government. Now, if it's true that they are about to form government, why are they so scared of the voters roll? As far as we are concerned, all those dead voters we saw in some constituencies, all those exaggerated voters, we want to assure them that if the new voters roll comes out, all those dead people will not appear on the voters roll. And in 2021, we will not see any of those strange numbers. And that is why some people are so dead scared of a new voters roll, because we are aware that it's not possible that from 1991, the same people who voted in 1991, none of them have died, none of them have relocated, none of them have moved. So, stop insulting the ECZ. This time around, it will be bumper to bumper. We are following you very closely," said Ngulube.

"Madam Speaker, I also want to say that the UPND is not a parallel government for them to start dictating to the people of Zambia how ECZ should operate. The ECZ is independent. And the same leader of opposition was telling the people of Zambia that Bill 10 is dead and that the ashes are in the Indian Ocean. So, if Bill 10 is dead, why do you want it to come on the floor of the House? So, the inconsistencies you have been labeling on ECZ are also being shown on your face Honorable leader of opposition."

And during her presentation of the motion, Vice-President Wina said there was need for ECZ to organize another workshop with MPs, to educate them on the online voter registration exercise.

She also opposed those complaining about the 30-day voter registration period saying the commission only required 33 people to register per day, polling station, in order to meet the target.

There's no coordination between health, finance ministries in handling covid donations – TIZ

A STUDY by Transparency International Zambia has revealed that there is no coordination between the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Finance in handling donations made towards the fight against COVID-19.

And the study has revealed that some private sector actors were making declarations of donations before they actually donate, giving them an opportunity to gain popularity based on falsehoods.

Speaking during press briefing, Friday, TIZ democratic governance lead officer Gilbert Mwanza said the lack of coordination among stakeholders signaled lack of information on the total amount of donations made.

"The first thing that TIZ noticed is that in terms of the coordination mechanisms, there is lack of effective coordination among stakeholders. Why do we say so? Through TIZ's engagement meetings with health permanent secretary administration

and the Ministry of Finance Accountant General's office, it was apparent that the two ministries are not sharing adequate information on specific records of resources management towards the COVID-19 response. It was further apparent that these institutions lacked information on the status of the total donations towards the response as would be seen from each making reference to the other," Mwanza said.

Mwanza said the lack of real time donation capturing and tracking mechanisms created an opportunity for falsifying or failure to capture all donations.

"In terms of the record keeping and updated information and resource management in COVID-19 response, as of August 2020, the Ministry of Finance could only provide statistics of donations up to June 2020. So you can imagine, July and August, they did not have the adequate information with regards to how much is there but the only information we could be provided with is up to

June. We are hoping probably by November, we will get something from August," he said.

He added that there was hesitation by government and some of the donors to provide information on donations.

"Colleagues, you can agree with me that if a person has donated in good faith, why would they refuse to give you the information of what they have donated? So for us that is a red flag because if you came out in the open to say, you donated K1 million to the Zambian people and when you are asked, how much did you donate to verify and you refer the person that is asking you to the people he donated to, it raises a very big question as to whether you genuinely donated that money or probably it was just window [dressing]," Mwanza noted.



Debt repayment suspension and its implications for fiscal space with Dr. Gabriel Pollen



The international community recognises the strain of the COVID-19 pandemic on economies around the world, especially on the poorest countries. Following appeals from the World Bank and the IMF, the Debt Service Suspension Initiative (DSSI) was established in April 2020 as a facility to allow debt-service suspension to the most impoverished countries, to aid their efforts in addressing the damaging effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. Indeed, given the Covid-19 pandemic and the subsequent projected recession of the Zambian economy of up to 5%, the Government of the Republic of Zambia has appealed to its creditors to give the country some breathing space. In September 2020, Zambia requested its Eurobond holders to suspend debt service payments for a period of six months.

Reportedly, China has responded to Zambia's calls for debt relief by implementing a debt repayment suspension plan, for instance, relieving and rescheduling US\$225million and US\$426.3 million for 2020 and 2021, respectively. For 2021, for example, China's offer amounts to around a third of Zambia's external debt repayment commitment. This is a substantial amount which would free up a substantial portion of domestic resources, allowing the government to allocate more resources to economic sectors. More debt relief from other creditors will provide substantial breathing space for the Zambian government.

Debt relief can permit greater fiscal space for expenditure programmes aimed at creating and enhancing the productive capacity of a country, which could also diminish the burden of debt in future, as enhanced economic activity leads to a greater resource envelope for the government. Zambia will need to design a suitable plan and create a conducive policy environment, while implementing projects and programmes that can bolster productive capacity of the country. This will require directing the freedup resources towards key productive sectors such as agriculture and industry, with swift gains in terms of surplus creation and provision of fiscal linkages. Debt repayment suspensions will free up more resources and permit the Zambian government to build local productive capacities.

The improved fiscal space from debt relief can also support private

sector activity by way of transfer of resources and creation of a conducive environment and liquidity provision for businesses. It really is about doing the right thing in economic terms in so far as this opportunity goes. But this requires putting in place mechanisms such as transparency and wider dialogue which will ensure that freed-up resources are being used effectively and efficiently for the intended purposes. Indeed, making the right policy choices requires multi-stakeholder consultation and engagement, and creating space and resources for the private sector to underpin integrated local productive capacities.

The improved fiscal space can also support and safeguard the lives and livelihoods of the most vulnerable sections of society. The idea though is to ensure that resource transfers due to improved fiscal space help the country's poorest people to learn and earn a sustainable living.

While debt service suspension can provide breathing space for the government, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic, it is essential that the freed-up resources are efficiently and effectively utilised to build productive capacities to enhance economic activity.

"So this way, we are literally sowing so much divisions in the country and we may reach a point where no one will be able to do anything about it, we will just be looking and that is very dangerous. So, international community, I am sure they are able to analyse what is happening in the country, they are able to do whatever they can to help us to try bring the nation together, to bring the country to order. presidents with the ECZ, holding a meeting and telling them that this is what we have done, so what do you want them to do? To say yes or to say no? That's not dialogue, dialogue you table, what are the issues, you table them; there is registration of voters, that's an issue, issuance of NRCs, that's an issue. So how do we deal with these issues because they are being talked about? People were telling me when I went to the Southern Province recently that people who are issuing NRCs are literally running away from the community, one minute they are in this school, when the community go there, maybe they just do four, five people and then they disappear. So people have been literally hunting for them. You cannot run a country like that because if you want to give NRCs to people, be stationed there and let people get the NRCs because that helps the process," said Kabilika.






do it with violence, with feelings of hatred and intolerance.



Guinea decides on third term for Conde amid voter-card concerns

VOTERS in Guinea went to the polls on Sunday to decide whether to extend the rule of 82-year-old president Alpha Conde, who in March pushed through constitutional changes allowing him to run for a third term.

At least 50 people have been killed over the past year during demonstrations against the new constitution, according to Amnesty International, and violence erupted repeatedly during campaigning.

There were no reports of unrest on Sunday, but a number of people including one of the candidates said they had been turned away at polling stations because of problems with their voter cards

The election comes at a delicate moment in West Africa, where concerns are growing over a slide in democratic gains. In August, Mali's government was overthrown by the army, while in Ivory Coast, months of protests against President Alassane Ouattara's bid for a third term on Oct. 31 have turned violent.

In the west of Guinea's capital, Conakry, dozens of voters queued quietly to vote in a primary school whose exterior was plastered with posters of Conde.

"I hope that things will happen in peace," said Mariama Camara, a housewife.

But across town in the Koloma Soloprimo neighbourhood, an opposition stronghold, several voters told Reuters they had been unable to participate because of voter card problems.

"When I arrived at the polling station, I was told my card was not valid," said resident Fatoumata Barry.

While no reliable opinion polls are available, many political analysts expect Conde to prevail after he won overwhelming approval for the new constitution in a referendum in March - although that vote was boycotted by the opposition.

"A HOLY MESS"

Conde faces 11 challengers, including his long-time rival Cellou Dalein Diallo, a former prime minister who finished runner-up to Conde in elections in 2010 and 2015.

After casting his vote, Diallo said he was worried that Conde would steal the election with "cunning and violence".

"We will not accept (that)," he said.

One of the candidates, former foreign minister Makale Camara, said she herself had not received a voter card at all, and so had been unable to vote. **BBC**

The governor of Nigeria's Osun state has escaped what officials call an "assassination attempt" when armed people attacked anti-police brutality protesters in the state capital Osogbo.

After marching with the protesters, Governor Adegboyega Oyetola was addressing them when shots were fired.

Mr Oyetola was not hurt but some of his aides were wounded.

Nigeria has been rocked by more than two weeks of protests against the Sars police unit.

Its officers are accused of extortion, torture and murder.

The government has promised to disband Sars Anti (Special Robbery Squad) but this has not satisfied the protesters, who have now broadened their demands, calling for an end to decades of corruption and mismanagement in Africa's biggest oil producer, which has left many young Nigerians economic with bleak prospects.

Thousands of mostly young people have once more taken to the streets of cities across the country.

The protests have also been backed by global celebrities such as Twitter founder Jack Dorsey, US rapper Kanye West, footballers Mesut Ozil and Marcus Rashford as well as Nigerian superstars Davido and Wizkid.

What happened in Osun?
A group of people armed with guns and machetes opened fire at the time Mr Oyetola was addressing the

protesters in the Osun state capital Osogbo - after he had marched and sang with them.

The officials were hurriedly taken into their vehicles for safety.

Stones were also hurled at the official convoy as it left.

The governor's spokesperson told the BBC

that the governor and his deputy survived the attack unhurt but some aides were wounded and a local journalist was in critical condition due to a serious head injury.

Officials say the attack was not carried out by the protesters but by thugs.

Similar attacks on the

protesters have also happened in the capital, Abuja, and the country's biggest city, Lagos. It is not clear who is behind them.

Mr Oyetola is from the same party as President Muhammadu Buhari, the All Progressives Congress.

What do the protesters want now?

The hashtag
#EndBadGovernance has
now been shared by almost
1.8 million twitter users,
while #BetterNigeria and
#FixNigeriaNow are also
being widely used.

"As long as there is no positive change, we will be here," one man told the BBC at a protest in Abuja on Saturday.

"The leaders, the elders have failed us. We need to begin the process of building a new nation by coming out like this," he said.

Door 'still ajar' for EU trade talks, says Gove

THE door is "still ajar" for talks with the EU over a post-Brexit trade deal but only if it moves ground in key areas, Michael Gove has said.

Negotiations between the UK and the EU have stalled amid disagreements over fishing access and competition issues.

The cabinet minister told the BBC that the EU must speed up the negotiating process and offer the UK better terms.

The EU has said it is prepared to "intensify" talks but it would not agree a deal at "any price".

It comes as the CBI and other business organisations urged the UK government to focus on bridging its differences with the EU, saying a deal was vital to help the post-Covid recovery.

They warned that uncertainty about the UK's future trading relationship with its largest market was "chipping

away at business resilience" at a time when many firms were being battered by coronavirus.

Downing Street said on Friday that official negotiations over a future economic partnership were "over" and the UK should "get ready" to trade with the EU from 1 January without a specific agreement.

Boris Johnson has accused the EU of resisting the UK's preferred outcome of a deal based on the one the bloc has with Canada.

The prime minister has said the UK should now be prepared for the alternative of a much more limited relationship, based on the EU's existing arrangements with Australia.

However, this would see tariffs applied on goods crossing the channel once the UK leaves the EU's single market at the end of the year, pushing up the cost of imports and exports.

'Drawn stumps'

The EU's chief negotiator, Michel Barnier, was due in London for talks with his counterpart, David Frost, on Monday, but the UK said this would be pointless without a fundamental change in direction from the bloc.

Mr Gove told the BBC's Andrew Marr that the EU "effectively ended the current round of talks" when its 27 leaders met in Brussels on Thursday to take stock of progress and said more was required from the UK.

"It was the case we were making progress but then the EU retreated from that," he said.

"We have drawn the conclusion that unless their approach changes, they are not interested and they have in effect drawn stumps."

Mr Johnson previously indicated that the UK would walk away from the talks unless EU leaders agreed an outline deal at last week's summit in Brussels.

Asked by Andrew Marr whether the UK was engaging in sabre-rattling or the door was still ajar to further discussions, Mr Gove replied: "It is still ajar. We hope the EU will change their position and we are certainly not saying if they do change their position we can't talk to them."

'No picnic'

Mr Gove said the UK was preparing for a range of outcomes, including leaving on what he described as "Australian terms", which would see trade between the two partners default to World Trade Organization rules.

"That is not going to be a picnic," he said on this scenario. "The key thing is we are taking the steps alongside business to be ready for that outcome." BBC

Thousands rally to support beheaded teacher

THOUSANDS have attended rallies across France in support of Samuel Paty, the teacher beheaded after showing cartoons of the Prophet Muhammad to his pupils.

People in the Place de la République in Paris carried the slogan "Je suis enseignant" (I am a teacher), with PM Jean Castex saying: "We are France!"

A man named as Abdoulakh A was shot dead by police on Friday after killing Mr Paty close to his school near Paris

An 11th person has now been arrested as part of the investigation.

No details have been given about the arrest. Four close relatives of the suspect were detained shortly after the killing. Six more people were held on Saturday, including the father of a pupil at the school and a preacher described by French media as a radical Islamist.

President Emmanuel Macron said the attack bore all the hallmarks of an "Islamist terrorist attack" and the teacher had been murdered because he "taught freedom of expression".

The murder comes as a trial over the 2015 attack on Charlie Hebdo - a satirical magazine that has published cartoons of the Prophet Muhammad is under way.

Where have the rallies been taking place?

The Place de la République in Paris filled with people rallying in support of Mr Paty, 47. Mr Castex and Paris Mayor Anne Hidalgo joined them.

The square was the scene of a huge demonstration in which 1.5 million people showed solidarity with Charlie Hebdo following the deadly attack of January 2015.

One protester on Sunday carried a sign reading "zero tolerance to all enemies of the Republic", another "I am a professor. I'm thinking of you, Samuel."

Another told Le Figaro she was a French Muslim who was at the rally to express her disgust at the latest killing.

A minute's silence was followed by the playing of the Marseillaise. All the protesters were wearing masks to protect from coronavirus.

Mr Castex tweeted the rendition of the anthem, along with the words "you do not scare us... we are France!"

Education Minister Jean-Michel Blanquer said France would succeed in defeating the enemies of democracy if it were united and that all teachers in France needed support.

Nathalie, a teacher from Chelles

who was at the Paris rally, told Le Monde she was there because she had "realised you can die of teaching".

In Lille, people carried banners and placards with the simple words "I am Samuel".

Thousands of people also gathered in Place Bellecour in Lyon to pay their respects, with another large turnout in Nantes.

Demonstrations are also being held in Toulouse, Strasbourg, Marseille, Bordeaux and elsewhere.

In addition to Sunday's demonstrations, there will be a national tribute paid to Mr Paty on Wednesday.

On Saturday, Tareq Oubrou, imam of a mosque in Bordeaux, told France Inter: "A civilisation does not kill an innocent person, barbarism does." *BBC*



Kane eclipses Rooney, Henry to set Premier **∟eague record**

HARRY Kane's blistering first-half performance for Tottenham against West Ham has seen Premier League records tumble as the England skipper notched up two goals and an assist inside the opening 20 minutes.

The striker was on song for Jose Mourinho's side in the opening exchanges against the Hammers, putting the spectre of an indifferent international break to rest in emphatic form as he had a hand in all three goals for the hosts.

The 27-year-old forward helped Spurs open their account inside a minute with an excellent long ball from inside his own half to find Son Heung-min out wide on the left, with the South Korean star cutting back into the box to curl a low effort past Lukasz Fabianski.

Son returned the favour only seven minutes later to tee up his team-mate just outside the visitors' penalty area, whereupon he slid the ball between fellow Three Lions man Declan Rice's legs before rifling a tidy finish in at the left post.

Kane then capped off a scintillating opening act when he doubled his tally just beyond the quarter-hour mark, rising to meet Sergio Reguilon's exquisite cross at the right post and head

The finish elevated the forward into esteemed company as he became the first man in almost a decade to notch up double figures in goal involvements after just the first five games of a Premier League.

With 12 in total (five goals, seven assists), he exceeded the previous records set by Manchester United's Wayne Rooney in 2011-12 and Arsenal's Thierry Henry in 2004-05.

His second goal also gave Tottenham their quickest three-goal haul in a top-flight game for over 13 years, when they clocked up three finishes inside the first 14 minutes against Derby County in

The pair of combinations between Kane and Son also put the duo on the cusp of matching a Tottenham club record for successful link-ups in a single Premier League campaign, with eight - just one behind the full-season record of nine achieved by Teddy Sheringham and Darren Anderton in 1992-93 and 1994-95, plus Sheringham and Chris Armstrong in 1995-96. GOAL

Liverpool fear the worst over Van Dijk inj

LIVERPOOL face an anxious wait to discover the extent of Virgil van Dijk's knee injury, amid fears the Dutchman is set for a lengthy spell on the sidelines.

Van Dijk was forced off just 11 minutes into the Reds' 2-2 draw at Everton on Saturday, following a reckless challenge from Blues goalkeeper Jordan Pickford.

He was sent for a hospital scan immediately after the game, with Liverpool's medical staff concerned at the possibility of serious ligament damage.

Club sources insist there have been no scan results at this stage, but beIN SPORTS reported during the Manchester City-Arsenal game that Van Dijk had ruptured his anterior cruciate ligament, and could face a spell of seven to eight months out of action. Liverpool were left deeply unimpressed by that report, making their feelings known to the Qatarbased broadcaster.

Jordan Reds captain Henderson revealed that Pickford, who was not even booked for the challenge, had sought him out at the final whistle, asking him to pass on an apology to Van Dijk.

Liverpool manager Jurgen Klopp, though, was unamused at the refusal of VAR to intervene and issue the England goalkeeper a red card. On the Van Dijk incident, Klopp said: "In the game, it was pretty quick. For me, it was a clear penalty what I saw and then obviously we saw that the flag went up, so offside. I still thought it's worth to have a look on the foul but that didn't

"We have no power there, we just sit here and now you discuss it with me. We have to ask other people about that.

"What can I say? I don't want to say Jordan Pickford wanted to do it but it's, of course, not a challenge how a goalie can do it in the box because there's another player. If it's not offside, it's 100 per cent a penalty. So it's nothing, that's all."

also Liverpool concerns over the fitness of midfielder Thiago Alcantara, who was on the end of a wild challenge from Everton forward Richarlison in the closing stages of Saturday's game.


Thiago was able to finish the game, with Richarlison,

who was shown a straight red card, later tweeting an apology to the former Bayern Munich man . But afterwards Klopp revealed the 29-year-old had complained of pain.

"When I left the pitch, Thiago told me in the red card situation with Richarlison he thinks he got injured," Klopp said. "We will see if it's true or not, but if he felt like this then we need to have a look"

To lose either, of course, would be a huge blow to Liverpool's ambitions this season. Van Dijk had, prior to Saturday, played every minute League matches, becoming totemic presence since his £75 million move from Southampton in January 2018.

Without him, Liverpool would have to rely on Joe Gomez and Joel Matip as their only specialist senior centrebacks. Matip himself only returned from a hamstring problem against Everton, emerging unscathed after his first 90-minute outing in almost a year, while Gomez too has a history of injury issues and has not been at his best so far this season. **GOAL**

ZBF sets ambitious plan for Olympics bound boxers

THE Zambia Boxing Federation (ZBF) have set up an ambitious plan for the three Tokyo 2020 Olympics bound boxers ahead of the event next year.

The world's biggest sporting event was set to take place this year but has been moved to July next year owing to the spread of the Coronavirus.

The three pugilists are Patrick Chinyemba from Exodus Boxing Academy, Zambia National Service's Evaristo Mulenga and Steve Zimba of Zambia Army.

ZBF general secretary Chomba said when he appeared on ZNBC's Kwacha Good Morning Zambia yesterday that the players who were set to enter camp in Lusaka tomorrow are also likely to travel to North Africa.

"Come Tuesday, they are entering Camp at OYDC; they will be in camp for about 90 days and our hope is that after that 90 days, we make arrangements to go and camp in North Africa. Our view is that we go to Cuba, then Japan later as the Olympics draw near," Chomba said.

He said the COVID-19 outbreak had derailed the progress of the boxers.

"It has affected them because boxing is a contact sport so if you just do shadow boxing without running and punching someone, you don't make progress so during the camp, we hope the training will be vigorous," said Chomba.
